The year is 2019, 47 years since our founding in 1972, and 21 years since Elizabeth Miller gave her home to the Madeira Historical Society. What does the society look like after 47 years? In 1972 the society began as the main tenant of the historical B&O Railroad Depot. Our organization gutted the Depot, completely rewired and installed new plumbing including a new bathroom. We painted the exterior and the interior, but it wasn't long before city council decided that the Depot would better serve the community housing a business. The first business in the Depot was a gift shop run by two sisters. Later it became Wally's Ice Cream, owned by Walter Albright, a Madeira resident and member of the society. The Madeira Historical Society was left without a place to call home, until 1998, when Elizabeth Miller decided that the community needed a place to display Madeira history. Elizabeth also decided that the society needed a permanent home, here's how it happened.

It was a very cold snowy night when Elizabeth Miller invited me into her living room, she had some news and wanted me to be the first to be told, she had made the decision, her home was to be donated to the Madeira Historical Society, after all some of our most prized possessions including the B&O RR Depot Pot Bellied Stove was already stored in her garage. This was 1998, I had been her neighbor since 1988, was already taking care of her two acres, mowing grass taking down fences and helping her husband Bruce with his vegetable garden. For some Madeira Historical Society members the gift was intimidating and even our president refused to sign his name on the documents accepting the property. Vice President Les LeFevre stepped up and put his name on the dotted line. We lost one board member who also was concerned about liabilities of accepting the property, he resigned as a board member. That was 21 years ago, our little museum today is a tribute to Elizabeth and to our members whom have contributed so much in blood, sweat and financially. What most Madeira residents and elected officials don't know is that Elizabeth left her property to every Madeira man, woman and child, the Madeira Historical Society serves only as "Caretakers", but no one should doubt Elizabeth Miller would be proud of the transition of her home if she were here today, 47 years after our founding and 21 years since the Miller House was left in our care.

Dianne was the first person appointed as Museum Director, prior to her appointment Marian Brown and Dona Brock had the title of Museum Curator, meaning that Liz is only the fourth person in 21 years having the responsibility of overseeing the Miller House Museum. The society has been fortunate to have had four incredibly dedicated women overseeing our museum.

Thoughts & Ideas, Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your new Miller House Museum Director, only the fourth to have this opportunity. I am excited and proud.

It has only been a few weeks and it seems like time is flying by, as we prepare for the annual Miller House Museum 2019 reopening. Every room in the museum has been touched, furniture has been moved upstairs and downstairs, to accommodate our new look. I will be inviting visitors this year to imagine themselves not as visitors, but as residents living in the Miller House at a particular moment in time, a time in Madeira history. Our Museum is displayed as it might have been in 1948 back in time, all the way to the 1800's. Early Madeira is now displayed in what was Elizabeth's 1st floor Bedroom. Who were the first families responsible for the earliest settlements in Madeira? The Hoffmann Library still is home to our collection of Greater Cincinnati, Northern Kentucky, and Madeira books and personal picture albums. The extra space in the Hoffmann Library will be used for changing displays, beginning with the current display of toys of historic significance.

Volunteers willing to serve as Docents and Greeters are needed at the Miller House Museum. Our museum is open beginning in April through December, and help is needed for "special" events including the spring visit of Madeira 3rd graders. Special Events, "En Plein Air" Art Event, "Teddy Bear Picnic" for Preschool children, are in the planning stage.



Our most urgent needs include a new driveway, six new front Porch columns And a sump pump installed in the garage.



Our driveway must be dug up and replaced, we can no longer just have it sealed. There are six columns on the front porch that are disintegrating and must be replaced. In our garage rain water flows from one end of the garage to the other, requiring that a sump pump be installed.
