
## MADEIRA HISTORICAL SOCIETY CORNER

## A 1948 Bird's Eye View by Carol (Klenk) Heck.

I found a wonderful aerial photo from 1948 of Madeira's "downtown". I hope you enjoy this view into the past; maybe even finding some of your own connections, or giving you a new insight into the history of Madeira.



- 1. Now the "Shoe Repair Shop"; in 1948 it was City Hall, Clerk's Court, and our Library.
- 2. Now, "A Tavola"; then, "Dot & Mac's"; a mom-and-pop corner store.
- **3.** Dot and Mac Baldridge's adjoining residence.
- 4. "Shawnee Meat Market" plus other small businesses (This building had residential apartments upstairs).
- 5. Madeira Post Office, now "Madeira Inn".
- **6.** Residence of Torsie & Hazel Keethler and family. (Now it's "McCabe's" along with # 7 and #8.)
- 7. Residence of Howard & Alma Erwin, which then became my parents' residence in 1951.
- 8. Residence of Homer & Susan Leever.
- 9. Now is the current Madeira Post Office. Then it was the residence of Joseph & Lucille Chaney.
- 10. Around 1952, this became the residence of the Richard Schultz's family at 7014 Center Street. Now it is "The Cottage", with a Laurel Ave. address.
- 11. Home of Ennis and Clara Simonton at 7012 Center Street.

- 12. Home of Vernon & Mabel Scott and family at 7000 Center Street.
- **13.** This was the location of Madeira's maintenance building. (I think it was there in 1948.)
- **14.** A. H. Nelson home and/or business.
- **15.** Home of Ralph & Florence Wilson, now "Woellner Antique / Restoration".
- **16**. Residence of Vincent & Mary Fischesser, now "SwingLine Grill" along with #17 & #18.
- 17. I remember this to be "B & B Mowers" with an adjoining residence in the back.
- **18**. The Muchmore Barn on the Muchmore property; #19.
- 19. Historic home of Joseph and Elisa Muchmore.
- **20.** Historic home of Charles, Maude and Cleo Hosbrook.
- **21.** Home of Albert & Catherine Purcell. (A house that was nearly identical to #20.)
- 22. & 23. The Presbyterian Church and gymnasium, respectively.
- 24. This is where Dr. Madden's veterinary business started in 1937. By 1948, I believe the corner was vacant.
- 25. The Mar-Jean building, with its 3

storefronts, is now The Catholic Shop and 2 other stores.

- **26.** The Kroger store built in the early 1940's.
- 27. & 28. Camargo Theatre and parking lot, respectively.
- 29. B. & O. Railroad depot built around 1872 or 1892.
