## Mayors of Madeira by Carol (Klenk) Heck

But who were they? Recently, I was asked to publish the list of Madeira mayors and to highlight one in particular. A granddaughter of Albert Swift told me that she saw her grandfather's picture on a website that had only a question mark for the caption. She misunderstood the site to be that of Madeira Historical Society and contacted us to set the record straight. We can now add a name to the face on that unknown portrait. That would be Mayor Albert Barton Swift, seen here. Albert Swift lived from 1903 until 1982. "He was the youngest mayor in Ohio



when he first held office in 1938 and 1939." \*<sup>1</sup> While serving as mayor of Madeira, he lived at 7308 Juler. He and his wife, Ruth Morgan Swift, had 2 children. He served 2 or 3 terms as seen below. "While in office he helped to form the Hamilton County Police Association and a river clean-up system." \*<sup>1</sup> He also helped establish the county's police communication network.

Albert was born in Texas, but at age 16 he was living in Bond Hill with his mother and some of his younger siblings. He completed two years of high school. Some of his other professions include toolmaker, efficiency engineer, and method engineer. He owned several dry-cleaning stores and earned his realtor's license.

Albert's brother-in-law, Robert Morgan, may have served as city treasurer during the time that Albert was mayor. Robert was married to Erma Dodson Morgan and they lived in Madeira at 7717 Camargo Rd.
